Help, Hope, Healing

The vision is not only to provide housing for these clients but also come alongside them in support and instruction as they constructively plan for their future and the future of their unborn child, breaking the welfare dependant life style. This will be accomplished through formal and informal education and mentoring.

Formal Education

Clients will be expected to continue their formal education. If a client has not yet completed high school, she will need to be enrolled in either public school, an alternative school, or study to complete a G.E.D course.

Looking to the Future

Each client will plan to support herself and her child.

Partnering with other community programs such as Rural

Resources, DSHS, and Worksource, we will work the client to prepare her for a self-sufficient future through continuing education and/or work experience programs.

Life in the Home

Clients living at the maternity care home will be expected to live as a family with the other resident clients and their house parents.

They will have responsibilities in the daily activities of the home. these responsibilities will teach and reinforce life skills that the client will need in order to live a self-sufficient life once they leave the home. Some of the responsibilities will include but are not limited to:

Cooking

- Meal Planning**
- Grocery Shopping**
- Meal Preparation**

Cleaning

- Laundry**
- House Chores**
- Yard Work**

Money Management

- Budgeting**
- Saving/Investing**
- Using a checking-account**

Clients will be expected to participate in parenting classes if they choose to parent their child either on their own or with the help of family. For those clients who choose to place their baby with an adoptive family counseling will be provided through a trained adoption counselor.

Opportunities for the resident clients to participate in church and bible study will be provided and encouraged.

Other Responsibilities

Clients or their families will be responsible for a portion of the cost to reside at the home. This cost can be covered by the client, her family or through DSHS.

Length of Stay

Clients will be allowed to stay at the home up to 3 months after delivery, if they choose to parent their child. This will allow the client to get use to the newness of an infant and the whole parenting routine. She will be in a safe environment where she can be supported. If at anytime she decides that she cannot realistically parent her child she will have the support she needs to make other parenting arrangements.

A client who chooses to place her child with an adoptive family, will be allowed to stay 2 weeks after delivery so she can receive the support and continued counseling that she may need.
